

Orinda Park Pool

Code of Conduct

All members of Orinda Park Pool must read and acknowledge the Orinda Park Pool Code of Conduct. The Orinda Park Pool Code of Conduct was created to serve as a reminder that the pool is shared by a large group of members, and we all need to work together as a community to keep the pool safe, clean and a fun place to spend our summers.

1. Children under the age of 6 must be accompanied to the bathrooms. Please do not allow your child to be alone in the bathrooms. Bathrooms are not play areas.
2. The bathroom at the Coaches Shack is limited to use by disabled members, coaches and staff. The bathroom will remain locked and a key must be requested from the lifeguard on duty.
3. Please limit all water usage in bathrooms. If exceptional water usage occurs, the showers will have to be turned off. Members should not use the showers to “warm up”, but only to shower off quickly.
4. The chairs in the shed are for adults only, not to be used by children for play.
5. All children who are not toilet trained MUST be wearing swimmer diapers. It is recommended to use elastic legged diaper covers to further ensure any accidents are contained.
6. All children under the age of 9 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult. The lifeguards are not there to supervise children, they are there to save lives.
7. All guests must sign in at the gate and members must accompany guests. Guest fees should be paid at the Canteen. If the Canteen is not open, you must pay your guest fee to the lifeguard on duty. Members are responsible for their guests. Guests must know that they will not be admitted unless the member is present at the gate.
8. If you plan to have a party at the pool, you must schedule it with the Pool Manager, confirm the date, and sign a contract for the party. Guest fees must be paid at the time of the party. The member host must greet their guests at the gate, and have them sign in. Guests must know that they will not be admitted unless the member is present at the gate.
9. Members should clean up the pool area when they leave. We need to keep debris out of the pool. Lifeguards are hired to monitor the safety of the pool and save lives.
10. Parking is limited to the front lot, and in designated parking areas only. Parking in a no parking area may result in cars being towed. There is designated handicapped parking in both lots.
